Wilkie said Tussey never misses an opportunity to put a smile on someone's face, or drive a patient all over town to fulfill a bucket list item, or even collect mounds of donations to give a patient or child in need.

Tussey, a retired business owner, has a heart for Hospice because of the care his mother received there in the final chapter of her life. "She had some of the the finest days of her life at Hospice," he said. "It's very unique and a wonderful experience here and from that day forward, I said if I get the opportunity when I retire I will do some volunteer work with Hospice."
